Carlos Kubrusly was born in Rio de Janeiro in November 1947. He received his Ph.D. from the University of Warwick in 1976, held postdoctoral research positions at the Universities of Warwick and Bonn, and has been a faculty member of Catholic University of Rio de Janeiro since 1972, where he became Professor in 1988 and Professor Emeritus since 2019. He has published over a 110 scientific articles in international journals and has participated in some 40 scientific conferences, all with paper presentation, including plenary sections at the Toulouse IFAC Symposium in 1982 and at the Newport Beach SOTA Conference in 1998, and has also been a member of program committees of several international conferences. He was the Editor-in-Chief of the journal *Computational and Applied Mathematics*, Birkhäuser, Boston, 1992–1998, and coeditor of the books Semigroups of Operators: Theory and Applications, Optimization Software, Los Angeles, 2002, and The Courant-Friedrichs-Lewy (CFL) Condition, Birkhäuser-Springer, New York, 2013. Kubrusly has single-authored eight books, namely, An Introduction to Models and Decompositions in Operator Theory, Elements of Operator Theory, and Hilbert Space Operators: A Problem Solving Approach, Birkhäuser, Boston, 1997, 2001, 2003, respectively; Measure Theory: A First Course, Academic Press-Elsevier, San Diego, 2007; The Elements of Operator Theory, and Spectral Theory of Operators on Hilbert Space, Birkhäuser-Springer, New York, 2011, 2012, respectively; *Essentials of Measure Theory*, Springer-Switzerland, Cham, 2015; and Spectral Theory of Bounded Linear Operators, Birkhäuser-Springer, New York, 2020.
